### Biographical Note:

Helen Genevieve Jennings was born in November 1925, in Pulaski County, Missouri to Jack and Grace (Fortune) Jennings. The Fortune family, were early settlers in Maries County, Missouri moving from Georgia in the 1860s. Helen married Forrest Jennings in 1941, and together they

had two children, Vienna H. Kelnstin and Forrest Arthur Kelnstin. She married Leonard Breeden in 1944, and together they had a son, Richard. Helen died in March 2010, and is buried in the Dixon Cemetery.

Vienna Helen Kelnstin was born on February 22, 1942. She had one child with Richard Friye in 1959, a daughter, Anna Marie, who was born premature and did not survive. She married a Bishop and together they had two daughters. Vienna married again in the 1980s to a Mr. Tyson.

**Scope and Content Note:**

The collection contains a photocopy of a scrapbook that contains obituaries, wedding announcements, and miscellaneous articles from the *Maries County Gazette*. The material concerns individuals in Maries County and the Crocker and Dixon areas in Pulaski County. The various articles date from the 1920s to the 1950s.
