**Historical Note:**

The Missouri Lumber and Mining Company bought property including the future site of Hunter in the southeastern quarter of Carter County in 1880. The company named Hunter after John Hunter, a major stockholder in the firm. The village became the junction of the Current River Railroad and the Cape Girardeau and Southern Railroad.

Hunter experienced a period of growth, circa 1900-1920. When logging in the area was completed, Missouri Lumber and Mining sold 75,000 acres to Munger Securities Company in 1912. Munger subdivided its holdings into small farms, circa 1912-1920. As a result, Hunter became a crossroads hamlet.
