Abstract: The Rolla, Missouri Photograph Collection contains copies of photographs and postcard views of Rolla and Phelps County, Missouri, from the family collection of Margaret Isabelle Rauch. Included are views of businesses, public buildings, and street scenes in Rolla, the Phelps County Fairground, and U.S. Highway 66. The photographs have been copied on 35mm black-and-white-film.

Biographical Note:

Margaret Herriott was born on August 5, 1860 in Knox County, Missouri to John Garrett and Deborah Ellen *Parker* Herriott. She married James Adam Stevens in 1880 and together they had eight children. He died in Rolla, Missouri in 1897 and Margaret married again in 1901 to Charles Battles. Battles died eight years later in 1909 and Margaret married for the third time to Jacob Rauch in 1912. Jacob died in 1919 and Margaret died on January 3, 1943.

Arrangement:

The collection has been arranged in its original order.

Scope and Content Note:

The collection contains views that are from the family collection of late Rolla resident Margaret Isabelle Rauch. Many of the views have never before been available. Some of the photographs, primarily those of churches, have been copied by the Phelps County Historical Society and are so marked. Views of downtown Rolla predominate, including several street scenes, interiors and exteriors of businesses, a major fire on Pine Street in 1939, and crews of the Rolla Fire Department. There is also a view of the Rolla Cemetery and south Rolla Street, and another featuring an unidentified individual standing in front of nondescript mounds of earth. The otherwise unimposing scene is thought to feature the remains of Fort Wyman and might be the only photograph of the earthworks on the site.

Other views in the collection have been reproduced from picture postcards. They include a "bird's-eye" view of Rolla, the post office, the deep railroad cut ("Coleman's Cut") west of Rolla, and U.S. Highway 66. Several of the postcards were published and sold by John W. Scott & Company, whose book, music, and drug store was a long-time feature on Pine Street. The collection has been copied on 35mm black-and-white film, with selected views also available on 35mm color slides.
