Historical Note:

Cedar County, Missouri was organized in 1845 out of parts of Polk and Dade counties. It was named for its abundant timber resources. Cedar Springs, located in north central Cedar County, was established around 1880. It was renamed Balm in 1910 after the claimed medicinal nature of the nearby water. The site was laid out by Thomas Eslinger in 1884.

Arrangement:

The collection has been arranged in its original order.

Scope and Content Note:

The collection contains photographs of the Messick and H. W. Evans general stores, the Cedar Springs Band, and a picnic of Camp 171 of the Woodmen of The World at Cedar Springs, and a view of the Balm baseball team. The views have been copied on 35mm slides.
