Abstract: The New Madrid Motion Picture Collection contains a compilation of home movies, transferred to one-half inch videotape (VHS), featuring street scenes, community events, and fairs at New Madrid, Missouri.

Historical Note:

The La Valle (see also LaValle, LaVallee, and Lavallee) family settled in New Madrid, Missouri prior to statehood. Originally from Quebec, Canada, Jean Nicolas Bouchard Dit Lavallee came to St. Louis, Missouri where he married Jeanne Chauvin in 1781. The couple were in New Madrid, Missouri by 1793 for the birth of their daughter Marie Louise.

Robert L. LaValle was born in 1902 to Jean E. and Addie (Congrove) LaValle. He married Laura LeSieur Combs in 1933 and served in the United States Navy during World War II. He died in Florida in 1988.

Arrangement:

The collection has been arranged in its original order.

Scope and Content Note:

The videocassette features movies made by the La Valle family of New Madrid during the 1940s and 1950s. A musical soundtrack and a few captions were added when the movies were transferred to videotape. Running time is approximately thirty minutes.

Reflecting its family origin, the videotape includes a number of scenes of infants, family pets, and the wedding of Mary Claire Mann to Harry F. Leuer. There are also a few scenes of downtown New Madrid, including the local barber shop and the courthouse. The segments most interesting historically include those featuring a baseball game, a structure fire, a Catholic picnic, a barbecue organized by the African American residents of New Madrid with dancing, and a procession of African Americans to the Mississippi River in what might have been a baptizing.
