This is Volume 2, Number 1 (January 1965) of *Pow Wow*, the newsletter of the Ozarks Empire Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America. Headquartered at Springfield in Greene County, Missouri, the Council served 225 units in six districts in southwestern and south-central Missouri.

This six-page newsletter provides administrative news and schedules for officials of the Boy Scouts throughout the Council area. Included is a notice that the Council's leadership had voted to shorten its name to "Ozarks Council," eliminating the words Empire and Area. There is also news of a special train that carried Scouts to a field day at Fort Leonard Wood.
