This is the souvenir booklet for the dedication service of Emmanuel Evangelical Church's new building on 20 May 1928. The church, founded in May 1867, is located at Jackson in Cape Girardeau County, Missouri.

The souvenir booklet contains a short history, membership roll, and photographs. Twenty-eight members were on the membership roll under the guidance of Rev. F. Kies, who preached every third Sunday of each month. Photographs feature the members of the Building Committee, officers and workers of the Sunday School, Ladies Aid, Mission Society, Mary and Martha Society, Young Peoples Leagues, Senior and Junior choirs, and the orchestra.

Local merchants and businesses subsidized publication of the souvenir booklet. Among the contributors were McAtee Mercantile Company, Witte Hardware Company, Paar Electric Company, Acme Grocery, Wagner Bakery, Groves-Snyder Motor Company, Jackson Mercantile Company, Rozier's Cash Store, Cracraft & Miller Furniture and Undertaking, and Reuter Organ Company.

This congregation is now styled as the Emanuel United Church of Christ of Jackson, using the same building dedicated in 1928.
