Historical Note:

The Conway, Missouri cyclone of 1908, struck on Monday evening November 23. Local papers described the damage as "two dwellings are reported to have been damaged, two or three barns blown down, fences laid low and hay stacks scattered over the farms." The Lebanon Republican

mentioned Mr. Garrison by name, reporting that "The farm house and barn of Charles Garrison, northeast of town, were entirely devastated." No one was injured in the storm.

Charles Garrison was born on December 2, 1861, the son of William Russel Garrison and Mary Janice Ingalls in Indiana. He married Mary E. Howerton on November 21, 1895 and they had two children, Ethel and Clyde. He died on February 6, 1949 at the age of 87. He is buried in Dotson Cemetery in Laclede County, Missouri.
