**Historical Note:**

John H. Brown was born on June 6, 1826 to Daniel and Julia Brown in Illinois. He married Sarah Bell on January 14, 1851 in Iowa. Sarah was born on October 5, 1831 in Ohio. Together they had five children, Eustace, Edward, Lena, Alta, and Sarah. John died on March 12, 1893 in Kansas City and Sarah died on June 1, 1929 at the home of her daughter Sarah in Kansas City, Kansas.

*The Good Life* was a publication that ran briefly in 1992 and then resumed publication as an illustrated monthly magazine in October 1993. It was printed in Rolla, Missouri. Publishers were Bob and Dannah Gresh with Bob Gresh serving as editor in chief. The publication covered current events, business news, human interest stories, education, and controversial topics for the Rolla area. Jacqueline Lomax, mother of Lindsay Bagnall, wrote for *The Good Life* in 1994 and 1995.

### **Scope and Content Note:**

#### **Publications**

The series contains issues of *The Good Life* dated from November-December 1993, January-December 1994, and January-June, August-November 1995. *The Good Life* was a monthly illustrated magazine publication from Rolla, Missouri. The series is arranged in chronological order.

#### **Brown Family**

The series contains family papers and the family Bible for Sarah Brown's family. Loose items and pages were removed from the Bible and placed in folder 6. The entries for family births, deaths, and marriages are recorded dating from 1821 to 1968. Folder 4 contains correspondence and newspaper clippings pertaining to the Brown family.

#### **Photograph**

The series consists of a photograph showing women at sewing machines in a factory setting. The location is unknown but the image dates from circa 1900.
