**Abstract:** This collection contains an unpublished 36-page report titled *Studies and Analyses Covering a Proposed Colored Amusement and Building Project to be Located in Saint Louis, Mo.* In the report, the Albert Wenzlick Real Estate Company proposes the erection of an entertainment and residential complex containing a theater, dance hall, five retail stores, a bowling alley, and 28 efficiency apartments for African Americans in St. Louis.

**Notes:** Throughout the report, the word "colored" is used to describe African Americans. "Colored" was the dominant term to describe African Americans during the Jim Crow era until the Civil Rights era.

## **Biographical Note:**

Albert Wenzlick was born on April 22, 1860, in Missouri to Peter and Mary Wenzlick. Wenzlick entered the real estate business in 1877 when he joined his brother, George Wenzlick in selling real estate business titles. In 1901, Albert founded Albert Wenzlick Real Estate Company in St. Louis, Missouri, specializing in general real estate. He became the company's president and oversaw the development of several residential subdivisions throughout St. Louis. He was married to Emma S. Wenzlick. Their son, Roy Wenzlick (1882-1981) worked at Albert Wenzlick Real Estate Company and established himself as a prominent real estate analyst in St. Louis. Roy eventually founded the Wenzlick Research Company in 1928, a real estate research company that specialized in real estate appraisals throughout St. Louis. Apart from becoming a real estate mogul in the St. Louis area, Albert Wenzlick was highly active in his community. He was one of the founders of Tyler Place Church, a Presbyterian church located in the Shaw Neighborhood of St. Louis, Missouri. Albert also served as a trustee of Westminster College. Albert Wenzlick died on August 15, 1937, in St. Louis, Missouri.

## **Scope and Content Note:**

The Albert Wenzlick Real Estate Company Report contains a 36-page unpublished report titled *Studies and Analyses Covering a Proposed Colored Amusement and Building Project to be Located in Saint Louis, Mo.* The report is divided into four sections labeled A, B, C, and D. Section A describes the growing population of African Americans in St. Louis and the lack of existing amusement areas for the community. Section B describes the population distribution of African Americans throughout St. Louis and the most suitable locations for the project. Section C acknowledges the cost and budget for constructing and maintaining the proposed building. Finally, Section D forecasts the potential profits generated from the entertainment and residential building project. The report has been maintained in its original order and was written in 1926.
