This collection covers African American people, businesses, culture, and organizations in the St. Louis area from the mid-1800s to the 1980s.

The collection has been arranged into 21 folders according to the order in which these materials were received.

# **Scope and Content Note:**

This collection contains correspondence, histories, manuscripts, programs, directories, reports, pamphlets, surveys, and national register nominations documenting African American people, businesses, and organizations throughout the St. Louis area. Materials of note in this collection include directories of black-owned businesses, such as the *Directory of Black Owned Businesses: City of St. Louis*, and a history of the St. Paul African Methodist Episcopal Church. The bulk of the materials in this collection date from 1921 to 1991, covering histories as early as 1841.
