## **Scope and Content Note:**

## **City Government**

This series primarily contains proposed and adopted city charters for St. Louis, published in 1914, 1915, 1950, and 1957. The charters delineate the city's boundaries, election processes, the legislative powers of the Board of Aldermen, and the administrative functions of city departments and officials, including the mayor. Materials of interest include *The Government of the City of St. Louis: The Summary Report of the Mayor's Advisory Committee on City Survey and Audit.* Conducted by Griffenhagen and Associates and the Governmental Research Institute between 1939 to 1941, the authors surveyed the St. Louis City government's policies, organizational structure, and the cost of government services provided to taxpayers. In the report, the authors criticized the city's government's organizational structure, arguing, for example, that the mayor lacked the necessary executive powers to ensure government efficiency. Consequently, one of the authors recommended elevating the mayor's powers to become the chief executive over all city departments. The materials in this series are arranged chronologically, dating from 1914 to 1957.

## **City Plan Commission**

This series consists of annual reports, zoning, street, and land use plans, and neighborhood revitalization proposals, documenting the City Plan Commission's efforts in the early-to-mid-twentieth century to develop strategies and make recommendations for the physical improvement and development of the city, including neighborhood revitalization, zoning ordinances for managing building size, location, and population density, and programs to reclaim slums and blighted areas. Annual reports chronicling the Commission's yearly progress comprise the bulk of this series, documenting the Commission's early efforts to implement the comprehensive city plan, a bond issue passed by St. Louis City voters in 1923 to implement the Commission's recommendations to improve streets, transit, transportation, recreation, zoning, and public buildings.

Other materials of interest include *Saint Louis After World War II*, a report published by the City Plan Commission that identified several negative trends—population loss, residential blight, slums, and lack of available land for new residential development—affecting St. Louis City. Among the report's recommendations are removing obsolete structures and reconstructing blighted areas in the city. Housing and the reclamation of blighted neighborhoods would remain a continued focus of the City Plan Commission in the mid-twentieth century, as reflected in the reports found in the later part of this series, *The Housing Situation in St. Louis: An Analysis by the City Plan Commission* (1953), *The Housing Situation in St. Louis: An Analysis by the City Plan Commission* (1953), and *A Report on Future Public Housing Sites*, 1953. The materials in this series are arranged chronologically, dating from 1918 to 1974.

## **Department of Personnel and Civil Service Commission**

This series solely consists of annual reports of the Department of Personnel and the Civil Service Commission, chronicling the Department of Personnel's yearly efforts administering the city's Civil Service System and the Civil Service Commission's mandate to oversee the city's merit system and hear appeals from city employees regarding disciplinary actions. The annual reports include but are not limited to, information on the number of appeals heard by the Civil Service Commission, lists of changes to the city's job classification plan, and statistical analyses of the distribution of service rating grades, compensation, and employee age and sex. The materials in this series are arranged chronologically, dating from 1968 to 1978.

## Department of Public Safety, Division of Building and Inspection

Annual reports written by the Department of Public Safety, Division of Building and Inspection comprise this series, documenting the division's mandate to enforce the city's building codes and zoning ordinances and issue building permits. The reports contain information regarding the number of personnel employed by the division, the number of permits, receipts, and inspection certificates issued for buildings and mechanical equipment, and graphs detailing residential construction and demolition and building activity in St. Louis City. The materials in this series are arranged chronologically, dating from 1961 to 1972.

#### **Division of Health**

This series consists of reports documenting the Division of Health's mission to ensure the community's ongoing health. St. Louis City voters approved an amendment to the city's charter in 1958 that created the Department of Health and Hospitals, which included the Division of Health and the Division of Hospitals (now the Health Department). Materials of interest include annual reports documenting the Division's activities, including its efforts to control venereal disease, rabies, and tuberculosis, as well as its public health education initiatives, which consisted of in-service training classes, lectures, and seminars, Health Division tours, and distribution of periodicals (newsletters, annual reports). The materials in this series are arranged alphabetically, dating from 1954 to 1962.

## St. Louis Public Schools

This series contains several reports commissioned by the Community Advisory Committee providing policy recommendations to help revitalize St. Louis City and the public school system after decades of depopulation and declining economic activity. Reports of interest include

Population Analysis: Executive Summary, which provides data on population and public-school enrollment trends in St. Louis City. The authors recommended that the city develop policies to retain 18-24-year-olds and child-bearing women in the process of starting families, marketing itself as a city of 'family values' to offset the city's population decline. The materials in this series are arranged alphabetically, written in 1985.

## **Transportation**

This series consists of reports regarding light rail, St. Louis City motor equipment, and mass transportation. Items of note in this series include a report commissioned by the Bi-State Development Agency titled *Feasibility Study for a Light Rail Alignment*, providing summaries of the report's findings, such as light rail goals and objectives, power distribution design, location and design of stations, visual and environmental impacts, and a cost-benefit assessment. After several years of analysis and planning, the Bi-State Development Agency eventually oversaw the implementation of light-rail transit in the St. Louis region with the opening of the St. Louis Metro Link in 1993. The materials in this series are arranged chronologically, dating from 1932 to 1981.

## **Community Development**

This series consists of single-folder accessions documenting community development proposals and initiatives in St. Louis City, focusing on neighborhood revitalization and commercial redevelopment. Materials of interest include *Garden Tower East Neighborhood Plan*, a project proposal drafted by the Community Development Administration (CDA) to revitalize the Garden Tower East neighborhood near Compton Heights. In the report, CDA recommended implementing a unified strategy, including changes in zoning laws and using existing tax incentives to rehabilitate blighted homes. Other items of interest include a proposal by Kenneth R. Langsdorf of the Municipal Business Development Commission titled *A Proposal for the Formation of a Venture Capital Corporation for St. Louis*. Langsdorf proposed several activities for the corporation, including funding commercial and industrial projects, such as the Gateway Mall, aiding economic feasibility studies, and matching funds for government programs like the First Missouri Development Finance Corporation. The materials in this series are arranged chronologically, dating from 1967 to 1985.

## **Subject Files**

This series consists of reports, maps, and property deeds, regarding regional planning, historic sites, housing, transit, and government services in St. Louis City. Materials of note are the Comprehensive City Plan for St. Louis City, which includes a map of St. Louis identifying proposed residential, commercial, and industrial districts, blighted districts slated for rehabilitation, and obsolete districts for reconstruction. Other items of interest include the St. Louis City-County consolidation plan proposed by the St. Louis Board of Freeholders in 1959. The plan proposed the creation of a new political entity, "The Municipal County of St. Louis," to govern St. Louis City and County. The former municipalities comprising St. Louis County would become boroughs, with two elected officials representing their respective boroughs on the "Legislative Council of the Municipal County of St. Louis," whose functions mirrored St. Louis City's Board of Aldermen. The materials in this series are arranged chronologically, dating from 1885 to 1980.
