#### **Historical Note:**

Robert Chatman Williams was born June 23, 1928, in Rehoboth, Alabama. He became a licensed minister in the Southwest Michigan jurisdiction of the Church of God in Christ

(COGIC) on March 27, 1958. Williams moved to St. Louis in 1959 and started working as an assembly line worker for the Chrysler Corporation, a position he held for 35 years. While in St. Louis, he joined the Memorial Church of God in Christ and served there until he was placed at the Crystal City Church of God in Christ in Crystal City, Missouri. After that, he was appointed pastor of the National Church of God in Christ located at Clara and Roosevelt streets in St. Louis. He worked there for over ten years. When the Memorial and National churches were combined, he was appointed pastor of the newly named National Memorial St. Louis Holy Temple Church of God in Christ. This church, located at 620 Spring Avenue, was struck by lightning, causing a devastating fire in 2000.

Throughout the years, Williams held many positions of leadership within the COGIC including Chairman of the Board of Superintendents of Eastern Missouri and District Superintendent of the M. H. Norman District. Williams supported COGIC missions in Africa ensuring that bibles and needed items were distributed there. He followed the development of the civil rights movement and, in 1999, was arrested for protesting inequalities of highway construction contracts in Missouri. He had a prison ministry, preached on street corners in St. Louis, and later, had social media accounts dedicated to spreading the gospel. He preached over a thousand sermons in 38 years of pastoring. He died on January 7, 2013.

## **Arrangement:**

The collection has been arranged alphabetically into five folders.

## **Scope and Content:**

The collection represents Robert C. Williams' interest in the history of the Church of God in Christ (COGIC). It includes copies of articles and photos about Bishop Charles Harrison Mason, founder of COGIC, its leaders, and the women of the church. The collection contains a directory of committee members and church members of Eastern, Central, Western and Northern District of COGIC in southwest Missouri and western Illinois. In addition, the collection reflects Williams' interest and support of African mission. There are copies of letters from ministers in Ghana, West Africa, and Lagos, Nigeria that reflect the turmoil of over two million Ghanaians being expelled from Nigeria. Also included are newspaper clippings about Dr. Martin Luther King and copies of family and congregation photographs.
