The YWCA collection covers the organization's activities from its inception in 1904 to the late 1970s. The constitution and bylaws, along with revisions and complete financial records are included. The St. Louis YWCA was divided into several branches, including a segregated club for African American women, and each of these groups is represented in the records, which include documentation on programs, summer camps, and clubs maintained by the various branches. The collection also includes a record of programs for which the YWCA shared responsibility with similar organizations, such as the USO, American Red Cross, and the YMCA.

The Young Women's Christian Association (YWCA) emerged as a social organization in England in 1855 during the Industrial Revolution in response to the social and spiritual needs problems of young women who worked in factories. The branch in the United States came into existence in 1866 in Boston through the efforts of the American missionary Mrs. Lucretia Boyd, who organized benevolent ladies to aid employed girls and women. The St. Louis, Missouri branch emerged out of the throngs of young women who arrived in the city during the 1904 Louisiana Purchase Exposition with the desire to seek employment. The St. Louis branch of the YWCA aligned themselves with the national branch in 1907.

The YWCA in St. Louis has proved pivotal in the lives of young women over the years and expanded its scope to include many other social aspects of life in the city. During World War I, it created Hostess Houses at military outposts, provided entertainment for the troops, assisted the Red Cross in operating their classes and aided in the sales of Liberty Bonds for the war effort in Europe. In 1941, prior to the United States entry into World War II, the YWCA assisted in the creation of the United Services Organization (USO) and affiliated with them to carry out the mission of caring for the troops.

The Great Depression catapulted the YWCA to the forefront of aiding young women in developing job skills for employment. As part of this effort, the YWCA of St. Louis provided employment services, counseling, and temporary housing. During World War II, the increasing numbers of women and young people who arrived in St. Louis in the defense factories, presented challenges to the YWCA. YWCA volunteers assisted in providing recreational activities for the women workers, attempted to ensure that juveniles remained in school instead of working in the plants, and addressing race relations in St. Louis. The focus on these social issues continued after World War II during the age of women's liberation and the civil rights movement of the 1950s-1970s.

The YWCA in St. Louis established summer camps for girls in Missouri that provided places of refuge for young women of all races from the hectic life of the city. To compliment this activity in St. Louis, the YWCA established residences for women and cafeterias that served the public and employed many young workers in carrying out the tasks of the organization. Women in the United States and around the world have seen their role in social life change during the twentieth century and the YWCA has nimbly responded to this challenge. With headquarters located at 1015 Locust in the 1990s, the YWCA operated recreational programs and educational curriculum
