Biographical Note:

Mary Margaret Ellis was born in St. Louis City in 1911 to Walter (1881-1957) and Julia (1888-1943) Aubuchon. Ellis's maternal grandparents, John and Maggie Bohan, immigrated from County Cork, Ireland, to St. Louis during the 19th century. Ellis had five siblings: Walter Jr.

(1910-1980), Albert (1915-1971), Katherine (1916-2009), Eugene (1914-1994), and Dorothy (1926-2023). Mary married Walter E. Ellis (1908-1991), a mechanic, in 1931 in St. Louis City. The couple had two children: Diane (1939-2013) and Robert (1946-). Mary Margaret Ellis died in St. Louis, Missouri, on September 10, 2008.

Scope and Content Note:

The Mary Margaret Ellis Memoir contains the 96-page manuscript *That's the Way It Was*, written by Ellis in 1980, with a foreword by Robert E. Knittel. Ellis divides the memoir into nineteen chapters. The manuscript describes the experiences of her close-knit, impoverished Irish family living among other immigrant families in the Soulard area of St. Louis, Missouri, from 1914 to 1930. Ellis chronicles everyday life, childhood games, folk and popular songs, participating in the Catholic faith, schooling, and instances of domestic violence. She writes about the songs, dances, foods, stories, and superstitions in Irish immigrant culture. Ellis recounts interactions with deaf and blind individuals in St. Louis, including learning sign language to communicate with her Deaf uncle. She also recalls world events from her childhood perspective, including World War I, the Great Influenza, Charles Lindbergh's flight from New York to Paris, and the Great Depression. The memoir has been maintained in its original order.
