Abstract: The St. Louis History Slide Shows contains three slide shows: a forty-minute presentation highlighting women who have made significant contributions to St. Louis, a slide show about the Western Historical Manuscript Collection (WHMC)-St. Louis Research Center's labor history collections, and a slide show about the St. Louis Collection.

Historical Note:

The St. Louis History slide show was created by the staff of Western Historical Manuscript Collection-St. Louis to promote the use of the labor history and women's collections held in their repository. These slides and scripts were used to publicize important women in St. Louis history, including Phoebe Cousins, Calamity Jane, Edna Fischel Gellhorn, and seven others. It is not known when these presentations were created.

Collecting Labor History

This series contains slides and scripts of a presentation promoting the collecting of labor history collections at the St. Louis Research Center. The series has been arranged by media type.

Notable Women in St. Louis History

This series contains slides and scripts of a presentation promoting the contributions of women to the history and culture of St. Louis. The presentation begins with Marie Therese Chouteau, the first white woman settler in St. Louis, and ends with Edna Fischel Gellhorn, a leader of the Suffragist Movement. Other women highlighted in the slide show include poets, doctors, teachers, philanthropists, artists, lawyers, and social activists. The series has been arranged by media type.

The St. Louis Collection

This series contains slides and scripts, and audio of a presentation about WHMC-St. Louis's collections. The series consists of one script chronicling the history of WHMC and the notable collections housed at WHMC-St. Louis, including the Thomas Dooley Papers, the Committee for Environmental Information, and the Margaret Hickey Papers.

Audio-Visual

This series contains cassettes, reel-to-reel film, and a VHS tape WHMC-St. Louis staff created to accompany the scripts and slides for the Collecting Labor History, Notable Women in St. Louis History, and the St. Louis Collection presentations. The series has been arranged by media type.
