Biographical Note:

Edward J. Thias was an accomplished architect, writer, teacher, and artist who was born in St. Louis in 1924. He completed more than 650 architectural projects, wrote and/or illustrated more than 20 books and calendars, and taught classes at two St. Louis-area colleges. He served as President of the Missouri Council of the American Institute of Architects and Editor of *Missouri Architect*.

In 1951, Thias graduated from Washington University's School of Architecture and five years later opened his own architectural practice in Sunset Hills, Missouri. He played a key role in the development of the City of Sunset Hills, creating the first master land and zoning plan for the city. He also served as the Chairman of the Sunset Hills Zoning and Planning Commission.

Thias taught architectural design at the University College of Washington University. He taught as many as 20 courses ranging from architectural design to watercolor painting. He also taught watercolor classes at the Meramec campus of St. Louis Community College. He died in 2008, at 83 years old.
