Introduction

In 1995, Francis Scheidegger donated his collection of tens of thousands of photographic negatives to the Western Historical Manuscript Collection at the urging of Bud Barnes. At the time, the former state senator praised Scheidegger's collection for the contribution it made to the preservation of a significant piece of Missouri history.

Scheidegger was the first local photographer in Kirkwood, opening a storefront studio on South Kirkwood Road in 1941. His earliest successes came after he photographed many stately residences of the neighborhood under a full moon following an ice storm in 1942. He sold the winter scenes to local homeowners. Thereafter, he developed his business by photographing weddings and other social occasions. Whether it was a local parade, a visit from a dignitary or other news-worthy event, Scheidegger could be found with camera in hand. But the significance of Scheidegger's collection goes beyond the well-known figures that appear in the photos. Historic preservationists will appreciate the detailed shots of buildings and homes in the historic cities of Webster Groves and Kirkwood, which are renowned for their architecture. Perhaps most valuably, his collection also documents the mundane – children marching down the street in Halloween costumes, backyard family parties, and small community events such as the opening of new businesses. On a sweeping scale Scheidegger used his camera to record the passage of time and lives of the residents, providing a unique view into suburban St. Louis life in the mid-20th century.

Scheidegger was a significant member of his community, and still well remembered today. In addition to his career in photography, he served as a member of the Kirkwood City Council for 28 years and was a passionate environmentalist. He answered the telephone at his studio "This is Francis Scheidegger, photographer and recycler." In 1995, the mayor of Kirkwood declared September 24 as "Francis Scheidegger Day," and named a recycling center in his honor. He died in 1999 at age 80.
