Kay Drey donated the Toxic Chemicals and Nuclear Waste files on May 16, 2006

Collects a subject file on the topic of toxic chemicals and nuclear waste and their environmental impact. It includes news and magazine articles, official reports, data and notes. Arranged alphabetically, with two sub-series: Genetic Engineering and material from reporter Lou Rose, each arranged chronologically. The alphabetical file includes material on the topic in general (f. 1-5) and contains significantly large accumulations of files on accidents (f. 5-22); "Bad Guys" (f. 49-59); dioxin (f. 93-f. 117); media (f. 181-205); waste disposal (f.283-393) and the Weldon Springs Ordnance Works Incinerator (f. 394-469). The Weldon Springs Ordnance Works is a land parcel in St. Charles County that required Superfund cleanup efforts after many years of having uranium ore processed there for nuclear fuel, which led to leaks of radioactive waste. Reporter Lou Rose wrote an award winning series for the *Post-Dispatch* that implied a connection between the waste and a significant number of leukemia deaths among children in St. Charles County. The Lou Rose series includes articles by and on the reporter, his notebooks and research material he collected. The collection primarily dates from 1980 to 2004 with three exceptions: folder 14, 1977; folder 139, 1969 folder 178, 1972; and 259, 2005.

Divided into three series: 1. Toxic Chemicals, folders 1-469, 1980-2005; 2. Genetic Engineering, folders 470-538, 1988-2005; and ; 3. Lou Rose, folders 539- 543, 1980-1987.
