Biographical Note:

James Bolger Cummins, was born in Tennessee, the son of Malachi Colonel Cummins, and Lucinda Sullivan. They relocated to Sparta, Missouri, shortly after the Civil War and moved in next door to the James Carter family. James Cummins grew up and eventually fell in love with Emma Jane Carter and they married in 1884. Together they had three children, though only Albert, would survive into adulthood. He too married the girl next door, Miss Mabel Allred. Together they had one son named Hubert Ray. All are buried in the Linden (or Friend) Cemetery in Sparta.

Arrangement:

The photographs have been arranged into five folders and are divided by subject. Most images are undated.

Scope and Content:

The photographs consist of portraits of adults and children, as well as snap shots of daily life. Most of the photographs are unnamed, though photographs of Albert and his parents have been identified. Also of note is a letter written to Emma by her brother Tom regarding the death of James. Correspondence is arranged chronologically. Photographs have been arranged topically.
