## **Scope and Content Note:**

# **Local History**

This series contains materials related to the people and places of southwest Missouri. Materials include school records, historical society publications, and records pertaining to various sites located in southwest Missouri. This series also includes a booklet describing the firsthand account of the Old Rose Bud Mine disaster, a published biography on Rose O'Neill, and a calendar with historical images of McDonald County businesses. This series is arranged by accession and kept in original order.

The Cookbook subseries contains cookbooks produced by Springfield organizations including Horace Mann Elementary, The Springfield Symphony Association, and First Baptist Church. The cookbooks contain names of the organizations' members, as well as advertisements featuring local businesses. The cookbook titled, *Harty Fare from the Parson's Table*, was written by Springfield native Joanne Oldham. This subseries is arranged by accession and kept in original order.

#### **Business Records**

This series consists of materials pertaining to various businesses located in southwest Missouri. This includes correspondences, annual reports, advertisements, and invoices. In addition, this series contains a strawberry token from Duenweg State Bank and two tokens from the Springfield Traction Company. This series is arranged by accession and kept in original order.

#### **Personal Records**

This series contains personal papers of various families or individuals from southwest Missouri. These materials include a family history on the Herman family of Springfield, Missouri, as well as a personal property record for Jacob Lack from 1868. This series also contains biographical information on Roy Wallace of Billings, Missouri, and a WWI souvenir handkerchief he brought back from France in 1918. This series is arranged by accession and kept in original order.

# **Photographs**

This series consists of photographs of unidentified individual portraits and family photographs. Many of the photographs were developed in southwest Missouri cities. Also included are photographs of southwest Missouri towns such as Springfield, Joplin, and the post office at Notch, Missouri. This series also contains a photograph from a 1911 Labor Day parade in Hannibal, Missouri. This series is arranged by subject and then chronologically.
