Historical Note:

The National Congress of Mothers and Parent Teacher Associations was founded on February 17, 1897, as a component of the Home Education Division for the Bureau of Education. The

organization's main goal was to educate parents on raising their children in a safe and healthy environment. To achieve this task, the organization published many works on the importance of education and a healthy lifestyle for young children. As a result, many movements formed to raise awareness of this issue.

The "Mothers' Congress", as it was known, established many agencies to facilitate this mission. These included Saving the Babies, Mothers' Pensions, State Child Welfare Commission, and Protection Against Child Labor. There also existed individual state chapters of this organization to promote the goal of each agency on a more localized level.

The most crucial element to ensure the success of the Mothers' Congress was the connections made with school districts, parents, and lawmakers. Leaders in education would regularly aid the organization in developing plans to promote children's health and well-being both within and outside of America's school system. Superintendents were also relied on to support the use of parent-teacher conferences at schools so that a dialogue could be maintained between the two sides.

An example of one of the main goals of the Mothers' Congress was to end child labor in America. It was found that children that worked these jobs were highly unlikely to pursue any form of further education. Also, the organization cited evidence that children were physically unable to properly perform many of the tasks that they were assigned in these occupations. To alleviate this problem, the Mother's Congress worked to secure pensions for widowed mothers so that children would not be forced to work to make up for the lost income.
