Biographical Note:

Margaret Marston was born June 25, 1870, the daughter of Solon Marston and Ivy Marston. She had two sisters, Hattie and Letta, and one brother Charles E. Marston, who was a co-founder and dean of the college that would come to be known as Missouri State University. On December 27, 1908, Margaret married Leroy Mansfield. He was twenty-one years her senior. Leroy owned a hardware store in Wheatland, Missouri, as well as several farms. Leroy died sometime prior to the 1940 census and Margaret passed away on September 10, 1965, at the age of 95. She was buried in Gardner Cemetery in Wheatland.
