Arrangement:

This collection was artificially created. It has been arranged into two folders in two oversize boxes and the pamphlets and menus were arranged according to size.

Scope and Content Note:

The collection consists of menus and brochures from restaurants and tourist attractions located primarily in the Missouri Ozarks. Some of the businesses represented in this collection include The Ozark Speedway in Joplin, Missouri, The Shepherd of the Hills Farm in Branson, Missouri, Silver Dollar City, and Marvel Cave Park, which predated Silver Dollar City. Restaurant menus make up the bulk of the collection. The menus come from restaurants all over the state, including the Bob Cummings, Inc., Hollywood Canteen and a restaurant called Henry's, located in Joplin, Missouri. Gino's Italian Cuisine, located on Lake Taneycomo and Aunt Mollie's Cupboard, which served tourists at The Shepherd of the Hills farm, were both located in Branson, Missouri. A menu for Rawhide Restaurant and Motel, on Route 66 in Carthage, Missouri, provides insight into the businesses serving travelers on America's famous highway. Menus from other parts of the state include La Bella View Restaurant in Goodman, Missouri, and Joe Hrdlicka's 'House of Steins' in St. Louis, Missouri. No location is given for Holiday Inn of America, and The Village Inn. None of the menus or pamphlets are dated but appear to be from the period of the 1950s and 1960s, based on the prices.
