Abstract: The Purcell Family Photographs collection contains photographs of the Purcell family and the Bois D'Arc, Missouri area. The photographs were taken between 1903 and 1951. It includes photographs of the Fairview school, which was a one-room schoolhouse in Pierce City, Missouri, which the Purcell children attended. The Purcell children are portrayed from childhood to adulthood.

Biographical Note:

Fred "Everett" Purcell was born March 4, 1883, the son of John Purcell and Narrissa Ernestine Fine. He was the fifth of eight children and married Etta West on July 19, 1903. They had five children: Geneva, Robert, Madge, Glenn and Lillian. Etta Purcell passed away in 1915, and Everett married Pearl Clayton with whom he had six children: Gladys, Harold, Clifford, Lorene, William, and Lena May. Fred and Pearl settled in Los Angeles, California, where she passed away in 1937. He died in Santa Ana, California, on May 11, 1963 and was buried in Fairhaven Memorial Park in Santa Ana.

Arrangement:

This collection is arranged into six folders. Photographs of a similar period were kept together. Since most photographs are undated, true chronological order was not possible.

Scope and Content Note:

The collection contains photographs of the Purcell family and the Bois D'Arc, Missouri area and were taken between 1903 and 1951. It includes photographs of the Fairview school, which was a one-room schoolhouse in Pierce City, Missouri which the Purcell children attended. There are also photographs of the Bois d'Arc School in Bois d'Arc, Missouri. The majority of the photographs feature the Purcell children during their childhood, though there are a few photographs featuring them in adulthood.
