Abstract: The RadiOzark Record Collection contains 427 phonograph records that were produced and transcribed by RadiOzark Enterprises, Inc., located in Springfield, Missouri. Program titles include *Strangest of All* with Frank Edwards, *The Tennessee Ernie Ford Show*, *The Bill Ring Show*, *The Red Foley Show*, "Shorty Thompson" in Saddle-Rockin' Rhythm, "Shorty, Sue, & Sally" Saddle-Rockin' Rhythm, and The Smiley Burnette Show.

Historical Note:

RadiOzark Enterprises, Inc. was founded by Ralph D. Foster in the 1940s as a radio production company located in Springfield, Missouri. RadiOzark operated out of Springfield's KWTO ("Keep Watching the Ozarks") radio station, which was managed by Foster, and founded by Lester E. Cox and C. Arthur Johnson in 1933. Si Siman was Vice President of RadiOzark, while Cox provided financial support. RadiOzark specialized in producing fifteen-minute shows that could be leased to other stations. These discs were known as transcriptions. The prerecorded programs starred Bill Ring, Red Foley, Smiley Burnette, and Tennessee Ernie Ford, among others. Eventually, more than 1,200 United States and Canadian stations aired their programs. RadiOzark expanded Springfield's music industry through country music, and would later go on to rival Nashville, Tennessee. Today, KWTO is owned by Zimmer Radio of Mid-Missouri.

Ralph Donald Foster was born in St. Joseph, Missouri, on April 25, 1893. In 1926, Foster and his business partner, Jerry Hall, set up a small radio station called KGBX in the corner of their St. Joseph Firestone tire shop. It began as a hobby, but many local businesses sought to advertise with them. In 1932, Foster moved the station to Springfield, Missouri. In order to increase transmitting power for KGBX, the license of a radio station in Grant City, Missouri, was purchased. In 1933, C. Arthur Johnson and Lester E. Cox founded KWTO ("Keep Watching the Ozarks"), with Foster as President and General Manager. Due to regulations set by the Federal Communication Commission (FCC), KGBX was sold in 1944. Under Foster's management, KWTO became the dominant station of the Ozarks. In addition to RadiOzark, Foster, along with his colleagues Cox, Siman, and John Mahaffey, created the popular weekly television show *Ozark Jubilee* (later known as *Jubilee USA*) in 1953. The Saturday night show was first broadcast on Springfield's KYTV. The program starred Red Foley as host and featured live performances by country music artists. Ralph Foster died August 11, 1984, in Springfield, Missouri.

Ely "Si" Siman Jr. was born in Springfield, Missouri, on January 17, 1921. As a teenager, Siman worked at Ralph Foster's KWTO radio station before joining the United States Navy. After World War II, Siman graduated from Drury College and later became vice president of RadiOzark Enterprises, Inc. He produced multiple radio shows including *Sermons in Song*, *Saddle Rockin' Rhythm, The Tennessee Ernie Ford Show, The Smiley Burnette Show*, and *The Bill Ring Show*. Siman became vice president of Crossroads TV Productions and co-producer of the *Ozark Jubilee*. In 1954, Siman convinced Red Foley to move to Springfield, Missouri, and be the host of the television program. Siman would also go on to publish major hit songs from Springfield including "Always on My Mind", which won the Country Music Association "Song of the Year" award in 1982 and 1983. The song also won multiple Grammy awards in 1983. On December 16, 1994, Siman died of cancer in Springfield, Missouri. He is buried in Hazelwood Cemetery.

Scope and Content Note:

12-inch LP Records

This series contains 106, 12-inch, long playing phonograph records produced by RadiOzark Enterprises, Inc. The majority of records are two-sided and play at 33 1/3 rpm (revolutions per minute). The duration of each program is approximately 20 minutes per side. The show titles include *Strangest of All* with Frank Edwards as narrator and *The Tennessee Ernie Ford Show*. This series is arranged by show title and then chronologically by program.

16-inch Transcription Records

This series consists of 321, 16-inch, transcriptions records produced by RadiOzark Enterprises, Inc. The majority of records are two-sided and play at 33 1/3 rpm (revolutions per minute). The duration of each program is approximately 15 minutes per side. The show titles are as follows: *The Bill Ring Show, The Red Foley Show, "Shorty Thompson" in Saddle-Rockin' Rhythm,* "Shorty, Sue, & Sally" Saddle-Rockin' Rhythm, and The Smiley Burnette Show. This series is arranged by show title and then chronologically by program.
