### **Biographical Note:**

Pansy Maude Knight was born on February 24, 1887, in Koshkonong, Missouri, to Wells George and Emma (Lamb) Knight. Pansy had two brothers, Carl Wells and Harry Hazleton. The family moved to Springfield, Missouri, where she attended Springfield High School. Pansy was a member Westminster Southern Presbyterian Church (later Tabernacle Presbyterian) and the Christian Endeavor Society. In the late 1920s, Pansy, Carl, and their mother moved to Los Angeles, California, where she worked as a bookkeeper. Pansy died on February 2, 1979, in Los Angeles, California.

Carl Wells Knight was born on March 24, 1885, in Koshkonong, Missouri, to Wells George and Emma *Lamb* Knight. After moving to Springfield with his family, he became a member of the Westminster Southern Presbyterian Church (later Tabernacle Presbyterian). Carl worked as a photographer for L. S. Kucker at Kucker Studio, located at 425 St. Louis Street. He moved to Los Angeles, California, in the late 1920s and worked for Stuart Studio. Later, he operated a photography studio in San Diego called Trease-Knight Studio with his business partner Sherman Trease. Carl died on June 15, 1984, in Los Angeles, California.

Westminster Southern Presbyterian Church was located at the northeast corner of South Jefferson and Elm in Springfield, Missouri. In 1915, the church disbanded and reorganized as the Tabernacle Presbyterian Church. A wooden tabernacle was erected on the southwest corner of National Boulevard and Cherry. Church ministers included Rev. Grayson L. Tucker, Rev. C. J. Allen, Rev. W. Hopper Adams, Rev. W. Bruce Doyle, Rev. John Crockett, Dr. William H. Butler, and Dr. F. W. Bosch. In 1920, the wooden building was demolished and on May 17, 1921, the cornerstone for the new church building was laid. In 1936, the church voted to change its name back to Westminster Presbyterian. On December 15, 1963, the last service was held at the National and Cherry location before the building was razed. Today, Westminster Presbyterian Church is located at 1551 East Portland Street.

#### **Arrangement:**

The collection has been arranged into eight folders.

### **Scope and Content Note:**

The collection includes a scrapbook, a photo album, photographs, photography business records, and glass plate negatives. The scrapbook was created by Pansy Knight and contains newspaper clippings, ephemera, and photographs of Tabernacle Presbyterian Church in Springfield, Missouri. The scrapbook also contains photographs of Springfield, and Pansy's family and friends. The loose photographs and corresponding negatives are of Pansy and her family members. The photo album was created by Pansy's niece, who is unidentified, and contains photographs of Grand Rapids, Michigan, during the 1910s.

The photography records are related to Carl W. Knight's photography career and education, including notes on chemicals and best practices for developing photographs. Also included are photography publications and convention booklets. Of particular note is a St. Louis newspaper titled *The News Monger*, dated 1897, and an issue of *The Missouri Valley Photographer* from

October 1918. The collection also contains glass plate negatives created by Carl W. Knight. Most of the glass plates are portraits of unidentified men and women. Other images include views of downtown Springfield, as well as an exterior and interior image of Marvel Cave in Taney County, Missouri.
