Biographical Note:

Violet Bartlett was born November 14, 1881, to David and Amanda (Finley) Bartlett at Niangua, Missouri. David and Amanda had three other children: Lenore (1885-1951), Edgar (1887-1969), and Margaret (1889-1949). Violet worked as a seamstress and lived in Kansas City, Missouri, Omaha, Nebraska, and Denver, Colorado, before moving back to Niangua. She was the president and publicity director for the Webster County Woman's Christian Temperance Union, as well as

a member of the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society. Violet regularly contributed to the *Marshfield Mail* newspaper, writing several "Letter to the Editor" columns and short stories. Violet died on February 5, 1957, in Springfield, Missouri. She was interred at the Niangua Cemetery.

Scope and Content Note:

This collection includes one letter and a prayer book written by Violet Bartlett of Niangua, Missouri. The letter was written on February 12, 1907, addressed to Edgar Bartlett regarding his twentieth birthday. The undated prayer book is titled "A Little Book of Prayers" and includes a short inscription by Violet.
