Biographical Note:

Ezekiel Carter was born in Greene County, Tennessee, on September 7, 1807, to John and Elizabeth Carter. He moved to Newton County, Missouri, in 1845, where he worked as a farmer and later married Rhoda Munsey Weems. Rhoda's first husband, John Weems, died on route to Missouri in 1843. She continued traveling west to claim her late husband's land in Newton County near the town of Stella. Ezekiel and Rhoda Carter had four children who survived to adulthood: Isaac, Virginia, Elizabeth, and Noah. The Carter's lost their land during the Civil War and moved to Benton County, Arkansas, where Ezekiel died on April 23, 1864. Rhoda moved back to Newton County after the war and passed away on December 31, 1899. She is buried at the Weems family cemetery in Wanda, Missouri.

Andrew Patten Carter was born on September 22, 1873, in Newton County, Missouri, to Isaac Munsey Carter and Francis Webster. The Carter family moved to Durant, Indian Territory (present day Oklahoma), where Isaac Carter worked as a Reverend for the Methodist Church. While living in Durant, Andrew Carter was the editor for the *Durant Eagle* and *Pioneer* newspapers. On April 29, 1904, he married Zella Estelle Shobe and the couple had two children: Dorothy and Andrew. By 1907, Andrew and his wife were living in Granby, Missouri, where he worked as the editor of the *Granby Miner* and *The Pilot*, a publication of the Missouri State Temperance Society. The Carter family moved again in 1913 to De Soto County, Florida. Andrew worked as a fire inspector for the state of Florida until his death on November 27, 1943. Zella Carter died on March 5, 1962. The couple are buried at Palm Cemetery in Winter Park, Florida.

Dorothy Martha Carter was born on July 12, 1908, in Granby, Missouri, to Andrew Patten Carter and Zella Shobe. She graduated from the University of Virginia and married Elwood Evans on December 23, 1930. The couple moved to Saltville, Virginia, where Elwood worked for the United States Gypsum Corporation. By 1983, the couple were living in St. Petersburg, Florida. Elwood Evans died on July 25, 1985, followed by Dorothy who died on December 22, 1990.

Scope and Content Note:

Family Papers

This series consists of materials related to the Carter, Munsey, and Weems families of Greene County, Tennessee, and Newton County, Missouri, including correspondence, newspaper articles, birth records, and compiled family histories. The family histories were written by Dr. John Denton Carter, son of Isaac Munsey Carter, and focus heavily on Rhoda Munsey Weems Carter and Dorothy Margaret Carter Evans. Folder 3 contains materials belonging to Rhoda Margaret Hunter, daughter of Isaac Munsey Carter, including a membership application for the United Daughters of the Confederacy. This series is arranged by subject and then chronologically.

Photographs

This series contains photographs of the Carter family, including several tintypes of Isaac and Francis Carter. The majority of photographs were collected by Dorothy Carter Evans and consist of family members, friends, various houses and landscapes, and trips abroad. Folder 13 contains images of servicemen, including Elwood Evans, during WWII. This series is arranged by subject and then chronologically.

Oversize

This series consists of a photo album and oversize photographs. The photo album contains duplicates found in the Photographs series and includes identifying information. The oversize photographs are also duplicates of images found in the Photographs series, most of which are portraits of Dorthy Carter Evans. This series is arranged by subject and then chronologically.
