**Historical Note:** 

William Washington James was born on December 19, 1896, to Dr. Isaac Logan James and Henrietta Christman in Shelbyville, Illinois. The James family moved to Kirksville, Missouri, in 1910 where Dr. Isaac James attended the American School of Osteopathy (now A. T. Still University). Following his graduation, the family settled in Springfield, Missouri. William studied music at Northeast Missouri State College at the age of 13, followed by composition with tutors from Peabody College. After serving in World War I with the 138<sup>th</sup> Infantry of the American Expeditionary Forces, William returned to Springfield to focus on religious compositions. His first composition, "Hear My Prayer," was published in 1927, followed by over 30 other choral compositions. Three of his hymns were sold over 250,000 times.

William owned and operated Will James Music Service in Springfield for over 36 years, earning him the title of Springfield's "Mr. Music". He was also the director of the Springfield Symphony in 1936 and was a member of Musicians Local No. 150 and the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers. William married choral director Clyde Lunea Cowdrey on May 17, 1919, and the couple had two children, William W. James, Jr., and Mary Frances James. William W. James, Sr., died on November 24, 1973. He was preceded in death by his wife, who died on May 3, 1969. The couple are buried in Eastlawn Cemetery in Springfield.

### **Arrangement:**

The collection has been arranged chronologically.

#### **Scope and Content Note:**

The collection contains published sheet music, composition drafts, and copyright agreements pertaining to William W. James' music career. There are 25 songs in the collection, including James' first published composition "Hear My Prayer." The majority of compositions include both the published works and James' handwritten drafts, in addition to copyright agreements between James and various publishers. The collection is arranged chronologically by date. Folder 22 has been left in its original order and contains multiple compositions that have been labeled "Unrenewed Copyrights in Public Domain" by James.
